### **New This Quarter**

#### • Marshfield Area Community Foundation Strategic Planning Complete

It had been three years since our last strategic plan. The board and committees did a tremendous job breaking down the 2019 plan into workable goals for the various committees. After three years we have many accomplishments including a new website, an improved marketing plan, and an improved financial summary for the board of directors. With a few vacant board positions, we look forward to implementing the new strategic plan with the 2023 board & its committees. Many thanks to the board members who participated in this full-day planning session and to Jamie Preder who facilitated our strategic plan.

#### • Changes coming to the Community Grants Program at the Marshfield Foundation

- The Community Grants Program continues to be a highly productive tool to get more money into our community addressing emerging needs such as mental health and food insecurity. We have a dedicated and thorough grants committee. They use money from the Community Grants Fund as well as money designated from the Forever Fund, the Women's Giving Circle Fund, the Senior Citizen's Endowment Fund, and the Mike Tauschek Fund.
- In 2023, we will begin a new grant cycle program. Applications will be open January 1-20 and again August 1-20.
- Before the Grants Committee reviews applications, fund holders of donor advised funds will have the opportunity to support grant applications. We will reach out to fund holders with a summary of grant applications.
- Our hope is that this will give fund holders the opportunity to have a first hand look at community needs. If a grant application is one of their passions they will have the chance to support the grant first either fully or just a portion of the request.
- This change will provide fund holders with a closer look at community needs as well as
  potentially allowing more money to be utilized for the grants committee which means more of
  an impact being made in our community each year.



## **Community Updates & Collaborations**

#### Keep Kids Warm

- 2022 was a very successful year for Keep Kids Warm. We provided close to 400 coats, hats, & mittens to area kids.
- We had an increase in Spanish interpreters which ensured families wanting interpretation services.
- We were so thankful for our volunteer lead, Elise Hahn, and the many other volunteers who helped make this a smooth running event. As well, many Marshfield Foundation board members helped out this year and were able to see this great community event come together.
- In 2023 we will be discussing the possibility of combining this event with other back-to-school
  events to decrease the amount of stops for parents. As well, we will look at the possibility of
  utilizing some gently used coats to help with our commitment to re-use and recycle in our
  community.

#### • The Good Heart Award

- The Marshfield Foundation and Hub City Times have joined together to award the first annual Good Heart Award. Community members are encouraged to nominate a high school senior living in Marshfield, WI who spreads unconditional, unwavering, and selfless kindness in the Marshfield community. Nominations will be accepted at info@marshfield.foundation until February 14th. Recipients will receive an award, dinner, and \$1,000 to donate to a Marshfield Area nonprofit of their choice.
