Community Updates & Collaborations

• Speak Your Peace Presentations are making a comeback

- Speak Your Peace was started with the Duluth Community Foundation to tamp down increasing banter with Superior, WI. They developed '9 Tools of Civility'. Activities designed to be fun while learning ways to disagree in a respectable way.
- We have recently collaborated with UWSP-Marshfield, Marshfield Area United Way,

- Most recently we completed a presentation for 100+ staff of Columbus Catholic Schools and an OLP women's group.

• Refugee Resettlement Efforts

Two families have arrived from the Congo. They have seen major support from the Refugee Resettlement Teams. Support such as setting up their home to connecting them to our community. Next steps will be helping the families find jobs, learn English, and hopefully introduce them to cheese curds!
