As a Trauma Education Specialist with the Marshfield Child Advocacy Center (MCAC) at the Marshfield Clinic, Tony's primary role is to provide direct trauma-informed and responsive supports to children and families who may have experienced relational poverty, childhood adversity and/or trauma. His vision for our community is to create safe and relationally rich environments for children, caregivers, teachers, and community members. Prior to joining the MCAC, Tony's career spanned 17 years as an art educator in Aurora, IL and Adams Friendship, WI. He also attended the 2012 London Paralympic Games, 2015 IPC Athletics World Championships in Doha, Qatar, and 2013 IPC Athletics World Championships in Lyon, France as a wheelchair track coach.
